




Explore the museum with our Summer at the Museum program!

Children, pre-school through early teens, are encouraged to sign up for the 10th annual *Summer at the Museum* program at the Carnegie Museum starting May 29. The program runs through August 4, with registration continuing throughout the summer.

Multiple visits to the museum over the course of the summer will allow kids to complete different sets of activities and earn a prize for each. Activities will vary by age, with the younger kids doing different activities than the older ones. All answers can be found in the museum, and the museum staff is always available to give hints and/or explanations. *Summer at the Museum* activities include puzzles, scavenger hunts, origami, and much more. Our current exhibit **Through the Eyes of STEM: The History of the Future** is featured, with many of the activities involving the content of those displays. Frankenstein's monster also comes to play, in honor of his 200th birthday.








Saturday, October 6: FrankenFest
